The publication presents a broad literature review of research conducted to develop *in vivo* testing procedures. It is our feeling that some of the research accomplishments reviewed were of excellent quality whereas others presented little work of value.

The author has summarized but made no attempt to evaluate the research. Therefore to properly evaluate this publication and its significance readers must either be well experienced in the field of Brucellosis or else examine each author's work that has been surveyed.

Each chapter has a long list of references which are of value to researchers in Brucellosis immunology.
