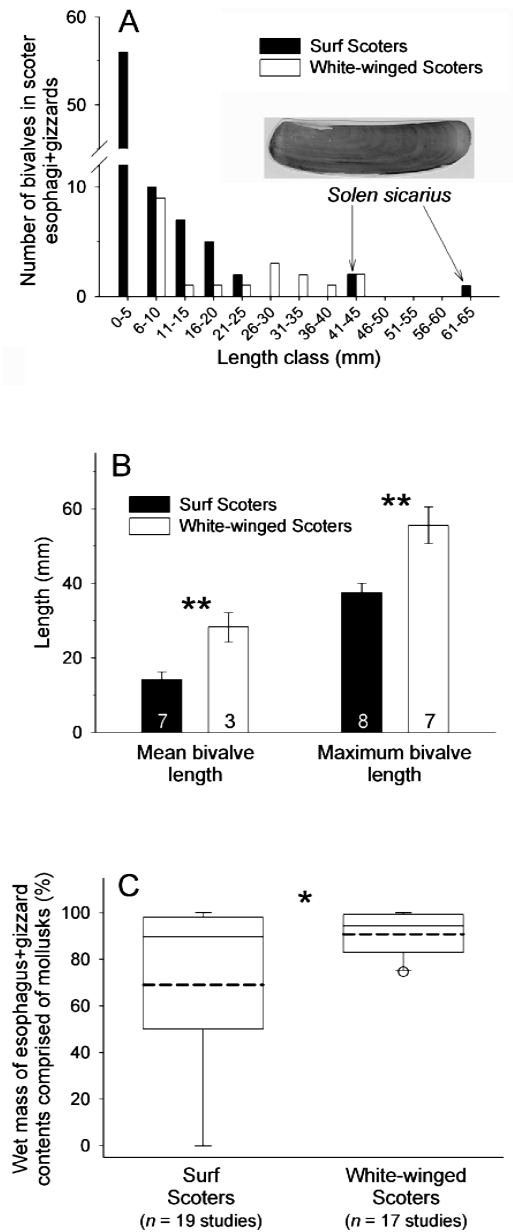

(C) Average percent of diet across this and past studies comprised of hard-bodied prey (mollusks) for Surf and White-winged Scoters. In (C), medians and means are represented by solid and dashed lines, respectively; boxes indicate the 25th and 75th percentiles, and whiskers the 10th and 90th percentiles (the circle is an outlier). * $P < 0.05$, ** $P < 0.01$.
