Annotated Bibliography of the Genus Conotelus Erichson (Coleoptera: Nitidulidae)

ERICHSON (1843) ERECTED THE GENUS Conotelus for two species of a taxon originally described by Fabricius (1801) as Stenus conicus F. and Stenus spissicornis F. and related species. At present, the genus comprises 24 species, of which the majority are Neotropical. There are a few species that range from the Neotropical to the Nearctic region (examples: C. fuscipennis Erichson, C. mexicanus Murray, C. nigricornis Sharp, and C. stenoides Murray) and a single species, *C. obscurus* Erichson, which is restricted to the Nearctic region. The only known escape from the Neotropical and Nearctic Regions is *C. mexicanus*, which is now established on several of the Hawaiian Islands (Nishida 1957).

Conotelus spp. are long, narrow beetles resembling rove beetles (Staphylinidae) in the genus Stenus; however, unlike the rove beetles, the nitidulids have clubbed antennae and, of course, they occupy different ecological niches. For ex-
