

Editorial Note

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Russian references in *Acta Palaeontologica Polonica* should be cited as follows:

Author's name in Latin alphabet, using the author's own transliteration, repeated in brackets in ISO 9:1995 transliteration, date, title of the paper translated into English, followed by: [in Russian], title of the journal in ISO 9:1995 transliteration.

The International Standard ISO 9:1995, a univocal system of one character for one character equivalents for Cyrillic and Latin alphabets does not require any knowledge of Russian language.

Book:

Янин, Б.Т. 1983. *Основы тафономии*. 184 ст. Недра, Москва.

should be quoted as follows:

Yanin, B.T. [Ānin, B.T.] 1983. *Osnovy tafonomii*. 184 pp. Nedra, Moskva.

Paper in an edited book:

Журавлева, И.Т., Мягкова, Е.И. 1974. Сравнительная характеристика Archaeata и Stromatoroidea. В: Б.С. Соколов (ред.), *Древние Cnidaria*, т. 1, 63–70. Наука, Новосибирск.

should be quoted as follows:

Zhuravleva I.T. [Žuravleva, I.T.] and Myagkova, E.I. [Mâgkova, E.I.] 1974. Comparative characteristic of Archaeata and Stromatoroidea [in Russian]. In: B.S. Sokolov (ed.), *Drevnie Cnidaria*, vol. 1, 63–70. Nauka, Novosibirsk.
