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The Long-tailed Antbird (*Drymophila caudata*) inhabits tangles of dense vegetation in the cloud forests of the Andes and northern South America. Integrating phylogeographic, morphological, vocal, and ecological data, Isler et al. (pp. 571–583) found evidence for greater species diversity and propose it be reclassified as four species, *D. klagesi*, *D. hellmayri*, *D. caudata*, and *D. striaticeps*.
