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In the first study of the natural history of the Slender-billed Parakeet (*Enicognathus leptorhynchus*), endemic to central Chile, Carneiro et al. (pp. 166–172) found that, at multiple spatial scales, radio-tracked juveniles used farmland and pastures with high densities of scattered mature trees disproportionately, highlighting the value of such trees to native fauna in an area devoted to agriculture.
